

unattended you can take the dog out of the system and tie him up to a stationary object. Never leave the dog unattended in the scooter- they could become spooked, tangled up and hurt.

- Severly reduce usage in hot weather, watch for hot pavement, and always be near a water source and or carry water.

- Be a "rider" and be in command of the steering and speeds by watching for cats, squirrels, other dogs, smells, etc. that may motivate your dog. Watch for dangerous surfaces (for dog, tires & clearance) such as gravel, sand, glass, bumps, ledges, etc. Keep your brakes adjusted perfectly and keep your tires well inflated & hard. In the beginning its recommended to wear a bicycle helmet- and always wear sturdy footwear. Check for loose hardware before each ride. Carry a bicycle flat repair kit/ tools and spare parts for the outrigger (rubber shock absorbers, wing nuts, bolts) Going off road is fine but remember the tires won't roll as easily in the softer material so help more by kicking.

- Keep your dogs claws clipped short
